#### **MSIT**

Kali Stender and Jean Prough came tonight to discuss repairing the light post near the Prospector that was damaged last year. The town has the replacement parts and will plan to get it fixed. The Main Street Improvement Team would like to be proactive with the appearance of the Main Street park. Mayor Stump would like to rent an aerator and fertilizer for all the parks this Spring if the town has water for sprinkling. MSIT is also looking to do something different with the planter barrels, the deer won't leave them alone. Dan Durham suggested using plantskydd which is a product to prevent deer from eating the flowers. Dan will help them with that.

# New Business

### 1. Annexation of 6B Tolson Lane Subdivision-Discussion

Mayor Stump described the 5 steps to annexation. He obtained templates from the City of Belgrade for the various resolutions that need to be adopted. The town will need to do a formal petition to annex, develop a resolution of intent to annex, a service plan that talks to any annexation, not just this piece of property. Adopt that service plan for the specific property by resolution.

# 2. Quitclaim Deed, Town of Sheridan to Pierson

David And Tammy Pierson purchased property on Washington and Montana and built a home on it to be sold. Upon the 3<sup>rd</sup> title search they discovered there was an unindexed deed of approximately 500 square foot triangular tract of land that was given to the town. There is a sewer service line, gas and electrical line within this triangular piece of ground. Pierson's will pay the Town of Sheridan \$1.00 and file a quitclaim deed. Dan Durham moved to authorize the Mayor to sign the quitclaim deed for the Pierson property. Emilie Sayler seconded the motion. No further discussion. Mayor Stump called the question for the council members. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Address change for brewery expansion -Discussion
The owners of Ruby Valley Brewery are preparing to move forward with the expansion of the existing building. The new building will be on the same parcel of land, behind the old Jensen's building with a possible walkway adjoining the two buildings. The parcel of land that they will be building on had an address of 101 E. Hamilton St. They are requesting the town allow them to change the address so they will not have to apply for a second license. The property will have to go through a lot line adjustment to make it one piece of property.

#### 4. Well update -Discussion

We have been pushing hard to get the procurement for the well digger out so we can begin getting bids in. We have more work to do before USDA RD will allow us to go to bid. It is likely that the Federal Government will be back on furlough again this Friday. Mayor Stump will be meeting with both Engineering Firms tomorrow to review each line item to make sure everything is included.
